Spokeo involved one of civil litigation's most basic questions: Did the plaintiff suffer actionable harm? Justice Alito's May 16, 2017 opinion for the US Supreme Court concluded that a "bare procedural violation" of a statute that created a private right of action did not alone constitute an injury in fact. In order to establish standing to sue, concrete and particularized harm must be alleged. Our speakers will address how federal courts have applied *Spokeo's* dictates in class-action and other civil litigation, discuss whether a consensus approach has emerged from those decisions, and forecast the ruling's continued impact.
